## who are we?

Fundacion Calicanto is a non-governmental, non-profit organization, founded in 1994 by members of the community of Casco Antiguo in Panama City, Panama. Casco Antiguo is the neighborhood where Panama City was founded in 1673 and a UNESCO World Heritage site that is quickly revitalizing after years of neglect.

Fundacion Calicanto's mission is to safeguard the Historic and Human Heritage of Casco Antiguo through social, educational, cultural, conservation programs and actions.



## the problem.

As we worked on the restoration of the architectural heritage of the neighborhood, we recognized that residents moved out of Casco Antigua because their economic situation did not allow them to participate in the revitalization of the area. It became evident that with this gentrification we were losing a diverse culture, which provided visitors and residents a fruitfu social dynamic.

Most of the residents of Casco Antiguo and its surrounding communities, live in poverty or extreme poverty. From a young age these people are at a disadvantage due to the lack of financial capital, education, or other needs that could improve their lives. As a result, they have become dependent on the government for aid and support.

Along with these well-known issues, lies an epidemic of emotional poverty and violence among the residents of these communities. Poverty has led them to unhealthy life-styles that cause low self-esteem and generate cycles/waves of violence for the whole family.

Despite Panama's economical growth in the recent decade, there is a social crisis due to a weakened education system and a lack of cultural policies that provide opportunities for our youth.

Experts point out that Panamanian youth is not well qualified to face modern life challenges, lacks values like assertive communication, team work, discipline and punctuality. The government invests very little in artistic development infrastructure and content wise.

### our proposal.

Taking all of these into consideration, in 2010 Fundacion Calicanto created **Enlaces**, a preventive program for at risk children ages 9 to 18 that develops their artistic potential through contemporary dance and gives them tools for self-care and social skills. Enlaces provides them a safe environment where they learn to respect each other, respect their bodies and ideas through performing arts.



**Enlaces**' aim is to grow as a local and regional cultural reference by educating a generation that becomes participatory and protagonist of social change through art.

Beginning 2016, Enlaces will also have the support of **Fundación Espacio Creativo**, a local NGO that promotes and fosters contemporary dance, and together with Fundación Calicanto they are developing a strategy to make the program grow towards said aim.

### how we do it:

We capture talent by calling open auditions in public schools of Casco Antiguo. Twenty boys and girls assist to our center from Monday to Friday, and train intensively from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., beginning in March to December, parallel to Panama's school calendar. They arrive to our foundation as soon as they get out of school, and we provide them with a healthy lunch, appropriate for their age development and the physical activity they go through during the afternoon. They take contemporary dance, ballet and theatre lessons, and we also help them with school work and provide psychological support, working closely with their families and schools.

#### achievements.

- Since 2011, Enlaces has received ongoing strategic support from Global Fund for Children that strengthens the program's structure and impact.
- In 2012, two boys from Enlaces were selected from a 600 children national audition to participate in a Panamanian television program called "Pequeños Gigantes". The program consists of 12 episodes in which children demonstrate their dance skills and charisma.
- Two of our children have participated in the dance and theatre productions "Alice in Wonderland" (2011), "Hansel & Gretel" (2014) and "Romeo and Juliet" (2015) directed by the renowned Spanish choreographer Fernando Hurtado.
- In 2013, Enlaces received the CARSI Grant (Central American Regiona Security Initiative) from the U.S. Embassy in Panama
- Enlaces received in 2014 the prestigious award from STARS FOUNDATION, that celebrates innovative and impactful NGOs worldwide.



- In 2014 two of our students won Gold-Medal in the international dance competition Danza Activa, held in Panama City.

One of our students was granted a scholarship to study in an intensive dance workshop in Orlando, Florida organized by Dance Theatre USA International, and another of our students received the opportunity of an intensive dance residence for a week in El Colegio del

Cuerpo, in Cartagena, Colombia.





2012 - Un Pequeño Gran Equipo (A Great Little Team)


